Before we get to the scores, here is an FRRL HF CHALLENGE Countries Update. The Republic of South Sudan, The 193rd member of the UN has finally been assigned a callsign prefix block: Z8A through Z8Z. So the new prefix for this 7/14/2011 created entity is Z8. It's also CQ Zone 34 and ITU Zone 48. For your logging software, it's DXCC Entity #521. On your 2012 Bill Erickson FRRL HF Challenge worksheets, please enter any 2012 contacts with this entity in the space provided now as ST0 South Sudan. We suggest you also add Z8A-Z8Z=ST0 on your DX Prefix Cross-Reference List.

Still on the subject of prefixes, Dick Illman, AH6EZ, who has been doing a lot of studying about Canadian callsigns lately, pointed out a longstanding error on page one of the worksheet. Please cross out the VE1 prefix shown for New Brunswick. VE1 is only Nova Scotia. VE9 is correct for New Brunswick.

It also helps that he is extremely knowledgeable about the subject of Amateur Radio. He is making sense out of the ARRL's License Manual. Each day he brought in various pieces of equipment or electronic components to show us the actual items we would cover in that day's lesson. For certain subjects he asked other special members to be the presenters. I am seeing much of what I have forgotten over the past 30 years.

For me the most important thing I am learning is how to study for my Extra Class license. Eric has followed a method I like and it will make the fall sessions easier.

DX Code of Conduct thanks to Jack Ekstrom K9JE for providing the following:

- I will listen, and listen, and then listen some more
- I will only call if I can copy the DX station properly
- I will not trust the cluster and will be sure of the DX station's callsign before calling
- I will not interfere with the DX station nor anyone calling him and will never tune up on the DX frequency or in the QSX slot
- I will wait for the DX station to end a contact before I call him
- I will always send my full callsign
- I will call and then listen for a reasonable interval; I will not call continuously
- I will not transmit when the DX Operator calls another callsign, not mine
- I will not transmit when the DX Operator queries a callsign not like mine
- I will not transmit when the DX station calls other geographic areas than mine
- When the DX Operator calls me, I will not repeat my callsign unless I think he has copied it incorrectly
- I will be thankful if and when I do make a contact
- I will respect my fellow hams and conduct myself so as to earn their respect

Community Activity to Encourage Youth Participation

On February 28, 2012 Mike K9FE and Harry,K9DXA (with the assistance of Dave KF9IO) demonstrated Ham radio to a group of students from the Pingree Grove, IL area. This was the first step towards the formation of a Cambridge Lakes Charter School radio club. Later on this spring Mike K9FE is teaching a soldering skills class for interested middle school students.
