HF Challenge Update for Mid-November

If you've heard it once, you've heard it a dozen times this year – it's never too late to get in on the fun of the HF Challenge! Reporting scores for the first time as of mid-November is John KC9OJV – welcome! Another late-start participant, Debby WX9VOR, reported her first DX contacts last month. "One pile-up took me over an hour to work through," she said, "but even with just 100 watts and a dipole, I made it."

Long-time participants are reporting QSOs with rare DX entities and say activity has been high. "Lots of new stuff on now," wrote Joe NA9A, "and sunspots are unbelievable." Among his contacts as of Nov. 15th were Congo, Andorra, Yemen, Juan Fernandez Is., Wake Is., Ogasawara, and Myanmar (Burma).

"The solar flux has been high and the DXing has been great!" said Larry K9ARZ. His recent QSOs included Wallis Island, Sierra Leone, South Cook Islands, Lesotho, Mauitania, Kyrgyzstan, Grenada, Socotra Island (Yemen), Bahama Islands, Turks and Caicos Islands, Montserrat, Tanzania, Ogasawara Is., Madagascar, San Andreas and Providencia, Pascua Is. (Easter Island), Wake Is., Monaco, Banaba Is., Juan Fernandez Is., Vanuatu, and Antarctica.

BYLAWS

Amended May 9, 2006

ENACTMENT

The final draft of this document was read and approved by the membership present at the Fox River Radio League, Inc. meeting held on November 11, 1997 and was duly recorded in the minutes of that meeting by the Secretary. Subsequent amendments are recorded in the minutes of the meeting at which they were passed.

(Editor's Note: the section shown below was taken from the club by-laws for members who are not familiar with the club election procedures.)

Article VII - Election of Officers and Directors

- Section 1. Nominations: The Nominating Committee shall present, at the November meeting, a slate of candidates consisting of a minimum of one (1) name per office. Nominations shall also be accepted from the floor at only the November meeting. All nominations shall be published in the next issue of the FRRL Newsletter, or failing said publication, a list of same shall be sent to all members via First Class U.S. mail, a minimum of one week ahead of the December meeting.
- Section 2. Election: The annual election of all officers and the directors shall take place at the December meeting. The balloting shall allow for write-in names. A candidate shall be declared elected if that candidate receives the most votes cast by the members.
- Section 3. Absentee Ballots: Absentee ballots are allowed only for the election of officers and directors. The absentee ballot shall be prepared by the voter and delivered to any officer prior to the start of the meeting at which the annual election of officers and directors is held. All absentee ballots shall be drafted in ink. The office being voted on with the first and last names or the callsign of each candidate shall be listed on this ballot. The completed ballot shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope that is both printed and signed in ink using first and last name of the voter. The ballots shall be opened and tallied at the election.

ARRL Contest News

A tip from the Volunteer Examiner community alerting us to be sure the study guides of our students are up to date. Hand-me-down copies and out-of-date books in libraries and stores can cause a lot of problems. The <u>question pools</u> are updated every four years. The dates for which the material is valid are usually printed on the cover - why not check what's available in your library and offer to update it if necessary?

Here's another anniversary - the WLS tower in Illinois has reached the advanced age of 75 years as described in this <u>story from Radio World</u>. Given the number of ice storms, such longevity is pretty amazing! (Thanks, Eric W3DQ)

Six meter operators were treated November 9 to an F_2 opening from approximately 1500 until 1630 UTC. "These have been very rare in Solar Cycle 24," said QST "The World Above 50 MHz" Editor Jon Jones, NØJK. He described the opening as "mostly single-hop F_2 " from the East Coast, Midwest, Gulf Coast, and to the West Coast to Central America, Northern South America and Caribbean.

Jones said the geomagnetic field was active, with a K of 4, due to what <u>Spaceweather.com</u> called "a gusty stream of solar wind buffeting Earth's magnetic field, sparking auroras around both of our planet's poles." Jones said he was "late to the show" because he'd worked the night before. He didn't get into the fray until 1550 UTC after he saw all the 6 meter spots showing up.

"I turned on the radio, and FM5AN, P43A, PJ4NX, etc were all blasting in loud here in eastern Kansas," he said. "I worked FM5AN and P43A from home using a M^2 loop in the attic. Jean, P43A said I was S-9. Nothing new or rare, but any F_2 on 6 meters in solar cycle 24 is a treat."
