President's Traffic

Another month has passed and we all move closer to the shortening of daylight and the possibility of colder weather. But we have had another great month of Amateur Radio. October was full of contests as well as the Illinois QSO party. Many of our members participated in the contest as well as some members that setup a portable operation at the Spring Brook Prairie Pavilion. Operating as W9CEQ was fun and a great opportunity for members to come out and operate. The weather cooperated and we had a wonderful warm day. In the morning before the contest Roger W9YU and I setup a tipper, one of the famous mounting bases designed by Charles KC9DAO and the Penninger Radio Company. We didn't use any mast sections, we just mounted a Cushcraft R7 directly to the tipper mast. The base was so stable that we didn't even have to guy the antenna. The R7 gave us 10 through 40 meters which we figured was ok as we had to leave the pavilion by dusk so 80 meters wasn't utilized. One nice feature about the R7 is that no radials are required so antenna setup is a snap. As it turns out, the tipper is a great solution as there are only small trees where we were located and the county we operated from will not allow any ropes or wires placed in forest preserve trees. Sounds like covenants doesn't it.

At that point one of the ops treated everyone by bringing his Flex radio. Many of the guys had never operated a Flex so this was an opportunity of a life time to get into a contest with the Flex. The Radio was interfaced to a computer with the Flex software and we were on the air. We had a second computer that we utilized as our logging machine with N3FJP QSO party software. During the operation as we had hoped, the antenna tuner was not needed as the R7 performed so well.

The Flex worked very well and has exemplary selectivity among all the other features of the radio. Since we were using the mouse to pick out contacts, the operators had to get used to moving frequencies without a tuning knob. I know this sounds easy, but it is a new method for a lot of people. During the contest the Spectrum display proved to be a great aid as our operating mode was hunt and pounce for the majority of the day. I realize more experienced ops might run a frequency, but H&P worked ok. Although the bands were crowded with contest stations, they appeared to be miles apart on the Flex display, just an awesome radio.

Now the issue for all the FRRL contesters is to turn in your logs and remember to identify yourself as an FRRL member station. I am excited to see how the club comes out in scoring this year.

So as October ends we have to look forward to more contests in November and our guest Speaker Gary Johnson at the November 8th meeting. Gary will be presenting a fantastic story about Quartz crystals, their history, manufacture, operation and future. Should prove to be interesting. Also mark your calendars as we turn back our clocks on November 6th. And last but not least, don't forget to get out and vote.


