Important Notice — New MF and LF Bands are Not Yet Available to Use!

The new 630-meter and 2200-meter bands are **not yet available for Amateur Radio use**. The effective date of the recent FCC *Report & Order* (<u>*R&O*</u>) granting these allocations has not yet been determined, and until the start date has been set, it is *not* legal under an Amateur Radio license to transmit on either band.

The fact that the new rules contain a new information-collection requirement — notification of operation to the United Telecoms Council (<u>UTC</u>) — complicates the matter of determining an effective date. According to the FCC *R&O*, the Office of Management and Budget (under the Paperwork Reduction Act) must first approve the information-collection requirements in §97.303(g)(2), which must be in place before radio amateurs can use the new bands.

Taiwan to Drop Amateur Radio Morse Code Requirement

According to an article in *Taipei Times*, the National Communications Commission (NCC) in Taiwan (the Republic of China) has proposed to abolish the Amateur Radio Morse code requirement and to permit operation on 432-440 MHz on a secondary basis, among other changes to the Amateur Radio rules there.

The NCC has said that a Morse requirement "should not hinder the development of Amateur Radio."

Although the NCC has approved the amendments, it must put them on public notice for 2 months and then make any changes it considers necessary, before they take effect.

The amended rules also will extend the term of Amateur Radio licenses from 5 to 10 years, although licensees must pass a test to qualify for the extension. NCC data show that 42,900 Amateur Radio licenses were issued in Taiwan between 2012 and 2016.
