I wish to thank ARRL Illinois Section Manger Tom Ciciora, KA9QPN, as well as our own FRRL member, ARRL Central Division Director Dick Isely, W9GIG for attending our festivities. Special thanks go to Past President, Dick Illman, AH6EZ for coordinating the excellent banquet, and thanks to our own "Brewmaster" Mike Rybinski, KC9JBX for his special tours and help with the event.

Congratulations to Kermit W9XA, the 2007 Ham of the Year recipient. Several candidates for this award were presented to the membership in December for consideration. All of those who were considered for this prestigious award are members who regularly contribute to the club, and who are passionate about the hobby and have dedicated much time and effort to promote amateur radio in our communities.

Several club members attended the Digital Workshop on the 12th of January. Thanks go to Mike K9FE who coordinated the event, and Denny W9HI for hosting the workshop at the Oswego High School electronics lab. FRRL hams assembled Buxcomm Rascal interface kits which are used for sound card digital modes of operation. Several other members were also in attendance to support the effort and to test the completed units.

Freezing temperatures did not keep 20 hams away from the January Transmitter "Fox" Hunt held on the 18th of January. The event was coordinated by Greg N9CHA and Denny W9HI. The "fox" was located at a residence in St. Charles and proved too difficult to find without specific clues. It was determined later at the post-event pizza party that more attenuation is needed for the DF equipment when such a strong signal is being hunted. The "fox" used this time was a Yaesu FT-8800 transceiver running 45 watts into a 3 element 2 meter beam at 25 feet above average terrain, pointed North. It was determined that the event was so successful, that we should coordinate additional transmitter hunts this year.

The Prisco Community Center in Aurora, the meeting place for FRRL club events has changed its management team. Along with the change comes a new relationship with the facility manager. New rules have been established which make the basement area no longer available to us for meetings. We will now be meeting in room 102, the large meeting room on the first floor where we have traditionally been holding our holiday party and meeting in December. The VE team will be holding their sessions in a first floor classroom. Please check the web site for further information as it becomes available.

The D-Star team has been very busy lately. FRRL members Kermit W9XA, Mark WB9QZB and Paul W9DWP were honored by the North Shore Radio Club on the 26th of January for their efforts. The engineering and installation of the NSRC D-Star repeater systems is an on-going project. An experiment is being conducted to see if two D-Star systems can co-exist on a splintered pair of frequencies. The FRRL UHF system is on 442.10625 and the NSRC system is on 442.09375. On Sunday the 27th, a special D-Star forum was presented by Mark, Kermit and Paul at the Wheaton Community Radio Amateurs hamfest in St. Charles.

For the love of the hobby...

I recently saw a contest listed in the QST Contest page called Freeze Your Butt Off. Considering that I have been experiencing enough of Winter recently, I thought that immersion would be a better (or more stupid) idea. This contest is all about QRP and operating outdoors where you are rewarded by having low temperatures at your operating position.

Since my RV has not had heat for the last several months, this seemed like a comfortable operating position that already had a place to mount the Buddipole mast. I used my Elecraft KX1 rig at 5 watts with an external battery. As I unwound the RF cables and extra antenna wires for a second band, I realized how stiff they were in the cold weather. I was happy to get all of the outdoors installation work finished and settle into finding "FYBO" stations to work. I heard none on 20m so I switched to 40m where I spend almost all of my time. I did manage to make 24 QSOs over a 5 hour span. However this included hourly breaks to go inside to warm my hands enough to regain cw paddle coordination. I also found that having a cold head affected my concentration at times. The temperature ranged from 25 to 29 degrees while I was operating.

This gave me a nice x5 temperature multiplier. I could not have achieved anything below 20F for a x6 multiplier anyway. It just was not that cold. It did not help that there was 8 inches of snow on the ground that I needed to wade through to stretch out the 20m wire (that I did not make a QSO with).

Part of the exchange given includes your name. I guess there is no need for accuracy because the W8PIG QRP club I worked had an operator named Oink. I guess that says it all. Everyone had fun. I am looking forward to next year.
