FRRL General Upgrade Class Scheduled

The FRRL will be holding a General upgrade class on five weekends in April and May. We will cover all of the material that you need in order to upgrade from a Technician class amateur radio license to a General class license. (Due to recent FCC rule changes, this now involves a written exam only.)

PREREQUISITE: A Technician class amateur radio license.

<u>LOCATION:</u> The classes will be held at the Batavia Public Library, 10 S Batavia Ave, Batavia, IL. The Library is located at the corner of Wilson Street and Route 31 in Batavia.

TIMES: Dates and times are as follows: (Note the varying start times!)

April 14 — 8:00am - 12 noon April 21 — 12 noon - 3:00pm May 5 — 9:00am - 12 noon May 12 — 9:00am - 12 noon May 19 — 9:00am - 12 noon

TEXTBOOK: There is no charge for the class; however, we do expect all students to obtain a copy of the ARRL General Class License Manual 5th Edition ahead of time, which will be used throughout the class. The cost is around \$20, excluding tax/shipping. The book can be purchased from the ARRL web site, Amazon, and other sources. Please place your orders ASAP so that you will have the manual when the class begins!

This national contest can be worked on bands from 80 meters to 70 centimeters, and includes the use of repeaters, IRLP and Echolink. It is phone only. The following is an excerpt from the website explaining the contest:

The purpose of this contest is to have fun and promote amateur radio among youth. The concept is relatively simple: Kids get on the air and make contacts with other kids and adults. Contacts with kids are more valuable than contacts with adults. We envision and encourage a little rag chewing as part of the contest. Remember, the idea is to have fun.

This contest is open to kids in the U.S., Canada and other countries under the age of 18. Licensed adults may participate in the contest but more importantly, licensed adults and amateur radio clubs are encouraged to help kids get on the air, make contacts and have fun.

In the United States, a licensed control operator is required for unlicensed kids to participate or for licensed kids to operate above their current privileges.

All U.S. amateurs must be follow the U.S. 3rd party rules. Non-U.S. participants must comply with the rules of their amateur radio governing organization, especially those regarding third party contacts with U.S. stations

The contest runs from 400 UTC Saturday to 2200 UTC Sunday.
