Repeater News

During the weekend of August 4-5, Kermit, W9XA, Paul, W9DWP, Earl, N9FNX, and Tony Huricon worked on our FM repeaters. They found a cross-band coupler mounted at the antennas which was not working correctly. After replacing that and doing a very thorough inspection of the antennas, feedlines and patch cables, they determined all was working much better. We now have a very favorable SWR on both the VHF and UHF systems. This has enhanced our transmitter output power, and vastly improved the receive capabilities. Reports on our Yahoo Group indicate the 2 meter machine reaches as far as Evanston to the east, I-39 to the west, and north well into Wisconsin. We are also hearing Bill, K9OZY, again from his location in Kankakee.

A new D-Star UHF antenna was installed in place of the one which was being used. The old one was purchased used, and must have something wrong with it since it never performed correctly. After the new antenna was installed, preliminary reports are excellent. Hams down at the lakefront in Chicago have been able to use the repeater consistently. If you are currently using D-Star, you will notice a great improvement in the coverage area.

Also, with the cooperation of Paul W9DWP, the FRRL VHF D-Star repeater has been placed into service. The frequency is 145.27. Be sure to set your Rptr call setting to W9CEQ C (two spaces after the Q).

The next repeater update is to swap out the old controllers with the new Arcom RC210 units. Dick AH6EZ has completed the initial testing and has made measurements in the racks for the install. There are a few programming changes that need to be completed, and interface cables to be built. A schedule for installing the controllers is pending.
